Young children are constantly tasting, touching and exploring their surroundings. This brings them into contact with many things around the home that may look good to eat and drink. However, these same things can poison your child. Poisons are everywhere in the home, in the garden and in the garage.

Many poisonings can be prevented by following a few simple safety messages:

Anei ētahi kōrero araitanga hei hāpai i a tātou ki te tiaki i a tātou anō i ngā tūmomo paihana:



Store poisons in their original containers.

Me noho tonu ngā tūmomo paihana ki te ipu tūturu.



Always store poisons out of sight and out of reach.

Me noho motuhake ngā tūmomo paihana kia kore e kitea, kia kore e pā atu.



Straight after use, return medicines and cleaners to their safe place.

Whakahokia ngā rongoā me ngā taonga whakapai tōtika ki ngā wāhi tiaki.



Check for poison dangers when out visiting.

Atatirohia ki ngā tūmomo araitanga paihana i ngā haerenga tu atu i to whare.



Ask for medicines in child safety caps.

He pai ake ngā taupoki arai tamariki.
